Invasive Species Mitigation FY 19 Stop Gap Amendment

In fiscal year 2019 it is necessary for the Invasive Species Mitigation (ISM) program to move awarded contracts from the 2019 calendar year to the State fiscal year. In order to keep multi-year projects on schedule the following the scheduled spring actives will be funded through a stop gap amendment.

Tooele County Weed Board EDRR and Invasive Treatment

This grant will be amended for time and an additional \$9,920.00 to complete the necessary spring stop gap activities. The Scope of work will not change. The additional funds will be utilized for chemical and labor for a spring treatment of Black henbane, Common St. Johnswort, and Yellow Starthistle. These species are in very limited quantity within Tooele County and need to be addressed as an EDRR spring treatment to prevent these species going to seed. This amendment will cover the cost of labor only. Tooele County will be covering the cost of chemical for these treatments.
