

**TOOELE COUNTY
RESOLUTION 2022-10**

**A RESOLUTION DECLARING THAT THE TOOELE COUNTY
COUNCIL DOES NOT INTEND TO IMPOSE A COUNTY OPTION
FUNDING TAX FOR BOTANICAL, CULTURAL, RECREATIONAL,
AND ZOOLOGICAL ORGANIZATIONS OR FACILITIES**

WHEREAS, Utah Code Title 59, Chapter 12, Part 7 allows the Tooele County Council to submit an opinion question to Tooele County residents regarding the imposition of a 0.1% tax on certain transactions to fund botanical, cultural, recreational, and zoological organizations or facilities; and

WHEREAS, Utah Code Title 59, Chapter 12, Part 14 allows the Grantsville City Council to submit an opinion question to Grantsville City residents regarding the imposition of a 0.1% tax on certain transactions to fund botanical, cultural, recreational, and zoological organizations or facilities; and

WHEREAS, before Grantsville City may submit the opinion question to Grantsville City residents, Grantsville City must first submit to the Tooele County Council a written notice of the intent to submit the opinion question to city residents and receive from the Tooele County Council a written resolution stating that the Tooele County Council is not seeking to impose a tax under Title 59, Chapter 12, Part 7; and

WHEREAS, on March 1, 2022, Grantsville City submitted the required written notice to the Tooele County Council; and

WHEREAS, the Tooele County Council is not seeking to impose a tax under Title 59, Chapter 12, Part 7;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE TOOELE COUNTY COUNCIL that the Tooele County Council is not seeking to impose a tax under Utah Code Title 59, Chapter 12, Part 7.

EFFECTIVE DATE: This resolution shall take effect immediately upon passage.



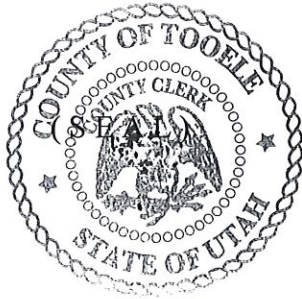

Dear Council Commissioners:

On behalf of the City of Grantsville, we are writing to express our desire to pass a resolution authorizing the PAR (Parks, Arts, and Recreation) Tax question to be placed on the 2022 ballot. We ask you to support us in a similar fashion as you have supported our neighboring city, Tooele, on their PAR Tax dating back to 2005.

This Notice is required by Utah Code Section 59-12-1402(6), which indicates that within 60 days of receipt of this Notice, the County Council should give to Grantsville City either of the following documents:

1. A written Resolution stating that the County is not seeking to impose the tax county-wide at this time; OR
2. A written notice that the Council will submit the PAR tax question to the residents of the county on the 2022 ballot.

With the approval of Grantsville's PAR tax, the State of Utah estimates that Grantsville City could receive an annual revenue of \$140,000. This funding could provide playgrounds, pickle ball courts, historic structure maintenance, pavilions, benches, dog parks, ball fields, park restrooms, and more. These amenities will enhance the quality of life not only of our residents, but also those in the county.

Grantsville City Council looks forward to receiving from Tooele County Council the Resolution referenced above. Please send it to Grantsville City, attention Atty. Brett Coombs. Thank you for your support of this important and positive community endeavor.
