PUBLIC COMMENTS DURING PUBLIC COUNTY COUNCIL MEETINGS

Prepared by Colin Winchester, Deputy Tooele County Attorney
Adopted: May 3, 2022
Effective: June 1, 2022

- 1. Except for (1) work meetings and (2) meetings the sole purpose of which is to consider a motion to close the meeting to the public, each public meeting of the County Council shall include a reasonable opportunity for the public to provide written comments and verbal comments during the meeting.
- 2. Persons may provide written comments to the clerk. All such comments shall be appended to the meeting minutes.
- 3. Persons who provide verbal comments:
 - shall identify themselves and their area of residence at the beginning of their comments
 - shall address their comments to the Council (not to others)
 - should not simply reiterate previous speakers' comments
 - shall adhere to time limits set by the Council Chair
 - shall maintain appropriate decorum
 - shall not use vulgar or offensive language
 - shall not engage in violent or disruptive or other inappropriate behavior
