In April 2022, our fire department invested \$5,955 to a end a low-angle rope rescue course through Weber State University. In June 2023 and addi onal investment of \$6,554 was made for a SPRAT Rope Access Cer fica on Course. THis comprehensive training has taught us the necessary skills to conduct efficient rope rescue opera ons. We are seeking assistance in acquiring the rope rescue equipment needed to execute these skills.

A trained and equipped Rope Rescue Team will directly benefit the visitors and residence of Tooele County. The improved ability to respond to incidents involving challenging terrain will increase the chances of successful rescues and reduce the poten al for injury or loss of life. Our department will be be er prepared to collaborate with neighboring agencies on mutual aid response, further enhancing

Stockton Fire Department has invested over \$12,000 in the development of a Rope Rescue Team. We currently lack the specialized equipment needed to perform these operations. This equipment will enable us to perform efficient rope rescues and ensure the safety of our firefighters during these high-risk operations.

Project Goals:

- Improve our capabilities to conduct rope rescue in dangerous terrain across Tooele County.
- Enhance the safety of our firefighters and community members during rescue operations.
- Decrease response times to incidents involving vertical/high-angle and low-angle rescues.
- Provide ongoing training to maintain a high level of proficiency in rope rescue techniques.

Currently, Tooele County does not have a rope rescue team or a rope access team. Rope rescue teams respond to a multitude of situations where the environment requires raising and lowering of responders, equipment, and patients. Areas like cliffs, steep embankments, caves, and mountainous terrain are places where this skillset is needed. Rope access teams respond to similar situations but work with vertical situations like windmills, towers, cranes, and tall buildings. Rope access teams have the ability to ascend or descend to individuals needing rescue.

This skillset and equipment has always been needed in this county. As Tooele County grows in size the need for this program only increases. We need the capability to safely respond to these situations. With this award, our program can gain the much needed equipment to finally make our team response ready and allow us to further our training with our own equipment.
